- **Community Court Watch** (<https://www.stattorney.org/resources/community-court-watch>)
 - In 2017, the BCSAO launched a new, online tool to engage the community in our fight against crime. Community Court Watch is a citywide database that enables the public to track the trajectory of arrests that have occurred in their neighborhoods. The Community Court Watch map is accessible on any smart device and features interactive data points that users can tap for court dates, outcomes, and other data related to arrests that have resulted in cases. This information enables community members to attend court, submit timely impact statements and attend transfer hearings held at the Juvenile Justice Center. The map focuses on the City's most violent crimes including homicides, non-fatal shootings, armed robberies, carjackings and animal cruelty.
- **Community Impact statements**
 - If your neighborhood has been impacted by a crime, you are encouraged to submit a community impact statement. These statements are read aloud by the SA during sentencing and provide an opportunity for the community members to tell the court how they feel about a particular crime, how the community has been impacted by the crime, and the resolution they would like to see from the case.
 - Judges often rely on these at sentencing

Crime info for Northern District as a whole (past 28 days)

- **NOTE:** the district is large—it is bordered on the west by Key Ave (Pimlico), on the South by MICA and Druid Hill Lake Dr., and on the east by Alameda
 - 2 homicides, isolated incidents
 - 5 shootings vs. 3 during same period last year
 - 1 self-inflicted, 1 road rage, 1 in connection with a robbery
 - 51 robberies vs. 27 during same period last year
 - robberies have increased city wide
 - 33 auto thefts vs. 27 during same period last year
 - a lot of these are due to leaving car running / leaving keys inside (people leaving their car running in the morning)
 - **Prevent crimes of opportunity:**
 - Lighting: porch lights on, motion sensors – well lit areas deter crime
 - Ring cameras – register them with the city.
 - Rebate to get a camera on the BPD website
 - Very helpful (particularly robberies and car jackings)
 - Make sure batteries are charged on ring cameras
 - Holidays: do not leave items visible in your car – do not leave packages on your porch
