Councilman Schleifer:

- Opened new playground in Falstaff
- Transparency in funding legislation to add the same level of transparency for contracts for grants to nonprofits. APRA \$.
- BGE upgrades: Working with BGE CEO to hold accountable Continuing to push for more rapid completion and addressing issues.
- Opposing a bike lane on Northern Parkway and Falls as part of 'Complete Streets' which has an emphasis on pedestrian needs.
- Speed cameras on Roland Ave? DOT is being non-responsive, unable to determine how they are prioritizing. Send an official letter from association with specific ask, at specific location.

Delegate Rosenberg:

- Will collaborate w/Yitzy on BGE issues; also opposes the bike lane @N. Pkwy.
- Fully funded the Kirwin Commission project for schools, renovating schools; also looking at improving school crossing intersections at N. Parkway and Roland.
- Protecting women's right to care for reproductive health, residents & out of state
- Keeping the Preakness at Pimlico: History is owner agreed not to do racing on Sunday in exchange for keeping Preakness in Baltimore.
 Laurel is likely not going to be fixed and we may get McKay and Breeders Cup. Redevelopment likely to take place starting May 2024.

• City Projects [Ricci]

- Northern Parkway and Falls Road Intersection
 - Initially got approval to redo the intersection; meeting w/DOT to honor what came out of the traffic study; things like Extending turn lanes, adjusting yield, etc.
 - Send drawing around to the community.
 - After the fact DOT inserted a first phase to put a bike lane on Falls between Northern and Cold Spring. Sent a joint letter from several community associations opposed to it.

Operation Pipeline Update

- If you have any open questions that you have, don't approve any work being done to your house. Bush removal/replacement, relocation of the meter, etc
- Phase they are in now is gassing each home, a new pressure moderating valve, and the *option* to move the meter from the inside of the house to the outside.
